This internal reprogramming action reprograms \$4.0 million from the SH-60 Series program to the MH-60R program for proper execution. This action does not use general transfer authority. This reprogramming does not change the purpose for which the funds were originally appropriated, meets all administrative and legal requirements of the Congress and has not previously been denied by the Congress.

**Explanation:** In FY 2002, Congress added \$4.0 million to procure one AQS-22 Airborne Low Frequency Sonar (ALFS) to be integrated into a Low Rate Initial Production (LRIP) MH-60R aircraft to support operational test and evaluation (OPEVAL). Funds were appropriated in the SH-60 Series modification program vice the MH-60R program in Budget Activity 1. This reclassification reprogramming is necessary to execute the funds in the proper program. This reprogramming does not alter the congressional intent for use of these funds.
