

This internal reprogramming action transfers \$.995 million from the Shipbuilding and Conversion, Navy (SCN), 02/06, appropriation to the Other Procurement, Navy (OPN), 02/04, appropriation. This action uses general transfer authority pursuant to section 8005 of Public Law 107-117, the DoD Appropriations Act, 2002, and section 1001 of Public Law 107-107, the National Defense Authorization Act for FY 2002. This action does not change the purpose for which the funds were originally appropriated, it meets all administrative and legal requirements of the Congress, and the Congress has not denied the item.

Explanation: This item is a congressional special interest item. In FY 2002, the Congress added \$1 million in the SCN appropriation to procure upgrades and improvements that will increase the capabilities of the Mine Hunter SWATH (MHS) vehicle located at Explosive Ordnance Disposal Mobile Unit Seven. These upgrades include a new SONAR, a magnetometer, and a side scan SONAR, which will improve the minesweeping capability of the MHS vehicle. The procurement of these items and modification of the existing ship are more properly financed in the OPN appropriation. Therefore, a reclassification reprogramming is necessary to execute these funds in the proper account. This reprogramming does not alter the congressional intent for use of these funds. The revised program amount has been adjusted for the rescissions in section 313 of Public Law 107-206, and section 8135b of Public Law 107-248.
