This reprogramming action transfers \$20.0 million from the Iraq Freedom Fund, 03/04, appropriation and \$60.0 million from the Iraq Freedom Fund, 04/05, appropriation to Other Procurement, Army, 04/06, appropriation. The funds will be used to provide ballistic protection kits to Army trucks and other vehicles. The transfer is pursuant to the Emergency Wartime Supplemental Appropriations Act, 2003, Public Law 108-11, and the Emergency Supplemental Appropriations Act for Defense and for the Reconstruction of Iraq and Afghanistan, 2004, Public Law 108-106.
