This reprogramming is submitted for prior approval because it transfers \$6.2 million from Research, Development, Test, and Evaluation, Defense-Wide, 04/05, appropriation to Operation and Maintenance, Army, 04/04, appropriation. This action uses general transfer authority pursuant to section 8005 of Public Law 108-87, the DoD Appropriations Act, 2004; and section 1001 of Public Law 108-136, the National Defense Authorization Act, 2004. This action reprograms funding in support of higher priority items, based on unforeseen military requirements, than that for which the funds were originally appropriated. It meets all administrative and legal requirements of the Congress and has not previously been denied by the Congress.

Explanation: Funds are required to pay for the U.S. share of the NATO Missile Defense Feasibility Study. The purpose of the study is to examine options for protecting Alliance territory and population centers against the full range of missile threats. Funds for the study were budgeted in the NATO Security Investment Program; however, Congress, while fully supportive of the study, did not believe that a military construction appropriation was the appropriate place to fund the effort. Based on General Counsel's legal opinion, the study may be funded from the U.S. contribution to NATO's military budget.
