This reprogramming action transfers \$2.3 million from the Iraq Freedom Fund (IFF), 04/06, appropriation to the Operation and Maintenance, Army, 05/05, appropriation. This transfer is in accordance with provisions in Title IX of Public Law 108-287, the DoD Appropriations Act, 2005.


**Budget Activity 1: Operating Forces** **+2,300**

Explanation: Funds (\$2 million) are required so that the Army has funds available to cover the potential liability for replacing the Zeus laser, should it be destroyed during operational field testing in Iraq. The Zeus laser neutralization system is an element of the hunter killer system. The Zeus laser is on lease and will be operationally tested from February through April. If the laser is destroyed during field testing, the Army is responsible for repaying the contractor who owns the system; if it proves successful, and a decision is made to field the system, this \$2.0 million will be realigned to the proper appropriation to buy the system. If it proves unsuccessful, and the liability is not incurred, the Army will reprogram funds back to the Iraq Freedom Fund before the end of the fiscal year so that they may be reapplied to other IED defeat efforts. Funds (\$0.3 million) are also required for the systems engineering support needed to integrate continually rapidly deployed IED sensor systems with existing U.S. Central Command operation and communication architecture to improve information fusion and targeting.
