This reprogramming action transfers \$80.157 million from the Iraq Freedom Fund (IFF), 04/06, appropriation to Operation and Maintenance, Army, 05/05, appropriation (\$33.097 million) and Other Procurement, Army, 05/07, appropriation (\$47.060 million). This transfer is in accordance with provisions in Title IX of Public Law 108-287, the DoD Appropriations Act, 2005.

Explanation: The transfer of \$80.157 million is required in April 2005 for delivery of a Joint Intelligence Operations Capability – Iraq (JIOC-I) to provide a technology information collection and dissemination process in the Operation Iraqi Freedom (OIF) theater of operations starting in June 2005. This project will be completed in December 2005. The purpose of the JIOC-I is to defeat the insurgent network by enabling a theater-wide counter insurgency campaign. The JIOC-I improves intelligence processes by sharing data that accelerates analysis and facilitates the maneuver of coalition forces.

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The JIOC-I allows greater collaboration of intelligence and information among national to tactical activities over an expanded Joint Worldwide Intelligence Communication System and Coalition networks. The JIOC-I integrates all intelligence activities into a network allowing analytical collaboration, access to a single "Iraqi Intelligence Database" across all echelons within theater. The JIOC-I has four parallel efforts: 1.) Establish JIOC-I; 2.) Integrate sensors to the network; 3.) Build a supporting intelligence network capability; and 4.) Provide predeployment/in theater training. The Department of Defense has included \$14.9 million in the Supplemental Request pending before Congress. This transfer is in addition to the supplemental request.
