This reprogramming action is submitted for prior approval because it uses general transfer authority pursuant to section 8005 of Public Law 108-287, the DoD Appropriations Act, 2005; and section 1001 of Public Law 108-375, the Ronald W. Reagan National Defense Authorization Act for Fiscal Year 2005, and is determined to be necessary in the national interest. This action transfers \$13.760 million from Aircraft Procurement, Army, 05/07, appropriation to Other Procurement, Army, 05/07, appropriation. This action reprograms funding in support of higher priority items, based on unforeseen military requirements, than those for which originally appropriated. It meets all administrative and legal requirements of the Congress and the Congress has not denied the items.

Explanation: The Unit Level Logistics System, Army (ULLS-A) is directly related to the Legacy Hardware Replacement effort under the Standard Army Management Information System (STAMIS) Tactical Computers (STACOMP) mission. It is Army Aviation's sole Tactical Level Automated Logistics and Maintenance Management System. The ULLS-A Software Change Package (SCP) 6 provides tactical level automation capabilities to support aviation weapon systems, expanded functionality, and greater soldier and leader visibility, flexibility, and capability. The failure to field ULLS-A SCP6 in FY 2005 will directly impact Army Aviation modularity and inhibit the war fighter's ability to effectively manage aircraft readiness and maintenance programs, and prevent the reduction in the logistics tail through more accurate forecasts of aviation spares requirements.
