This action is submitted for prior approval because it involves a Congressional Special Interest Item. This action realigns \$1.8 million within the Research, Development, Test, and Evaluation, Air Force, 04/05, appropriation to enhance the Hard Surface Target Ordnance Project (HardSTOP) technology development and demonstration effort. The funding involved for FY 2004 is the \$1.8 million added by Congress for the Passive Attack Weapon (PAW). HardSTOP is designed to defeat multi-story structures and shallow bunkers. HardSTOP submunitions contain a small amount of high explosive and are delivered in a modified Wind Corrected Munitions Dispenser. This action meets all administrative and legal requirements of the Congress and has not been previously denied by Congress.
