<u>Description</u>: This project funds the construction of a flight operations facility. The facility has flight planning, pilot safety equipment (ALSE) storage, classroom & locker rooms. This project will replace existing facilities, which can not accommodate the airframes and functionality of the unit.

<u>Justification</u>: In September of 2005 a contract for the flight operations facility was awarded but later cancelled as a result of unforeseen environmental issues that prohibited execution of the project in that location. Since then, the Guard has been working to identify alternative sites and in FY 2008, a contract was awarded with an architect and construction contractor to complete the design phase. During the design phase, cost estimates to complete the project were developed, and these estimates revealed that the project is \$3.3 million higher than originally estimated. The primary reason is due to sharp increases in construction materials and subsequent inflation increases to date.

Source of Funds. The following project has been cancelled and funds left from this project will be used as the source of funds for this reprogramming action.

Description: The SOF Headquarters and Motor Pool Complex provide facilities to house a new 91st Civil Affairs Battalion (CAB) to accommodate the 95th Civil Affairs Brigade transformation from one battalion to one brigade and four battalions.

Justification: Congress appropriated \$39.25 million for this project in the United States Special Operations Command's (USSOCOM) FY 2008 Military Construction program.

The higher funding requirement for the SOF Headquarters and Motor Pool Complex is due to the complexity and volume of construction currently ongoing at Fort Bragg, North Carolina. The pool of qualified bidders, reduced skilled labor available in the area, and volatile market conditions for a variety of construction materials have all resulted in a higher bidding climate.

USSOCOM awarded a contract for this project on February 29, 2008 for \$38,019,000. However, a four-company operations module was not affordable at the time, but USSOCOM was able to negotiate an option. Reprogramming additional funds will fully fund the option (to the original scope of the project) to support the 91st CAB activation in FY 2009. USSOCOM could not have foreseen or reasonably anticipate this bidding climate when the budget for this project was set in 2006.

Source of Funds: Funds are available due to bid savings on the following project. A contract was awarded for this project to a contractor already mobilized on an adjacent site taking advantage of proximity and reduced equipment mobilization costs, and the availability of pre-existing relationships with suppliers, and storage and lay down areas.
