<u>Part I</u> of this reprogramming action transfers \$8.746 million within two FY 2008 Defense appropriations. It does not use general transfer authority pursuant to section 8005 of Public Law 110-116, the Department of Defense (DoD) Appropriations Act, 2008; and section 1001 of Public Law 110-181, the National Defense Authorization Act for Fiscal Year 2008.

<u>Part II</u> of this reprogramming action transfers \$90.973 million among various FY 2007 Defense appropriations and includes financing for a new start. It uses \$35.0 million of general transfer authority pursuant to section 8005 of Public Law 109-289, the DoD Appropriations Act, 2007; and section 1001 of Public Law 109-364, the John Warner National Defense Authorization Act for FY 2007.

<u>Part III</u> of this reprogramming action transfers \$12.789 million for an FY 2004 Shipbuilding and Conversion, Navy program. It uses \$12.789 million of general transfer authority pursuant to section 8005 of Public Law 108-87, the DoD Appropriations Act, 2004; and section 1001 of Public Law 108-136, the National Defense Authorization Act for FY 2004.

<u>Part IV</u> of this reprogramming action transfers \$34.0 million within the FY 2003 Shipbuilding and Conversion, Navy appropriation. It uses \$34.0 million of general transfer authority pursuant to section 8005 of Public Law 107-248, the DoD Appropriations Act, 2003; and section 1001 of Public Law 107-314, the Bob Stump National Defense Authorization Act for FY 2003.

These actions reprogram funding in support of higher priority items, based on unforeseen military requirements, than those for which originally appropriated; and are determined to be necessary in the national interest. They meet all administrative and legal requirements and none of the items has been previously denied by the Congress.
