
<u>Description</u>: This project constructs a permanent pipeline to replace the existing expeditionary fuel pipeline (approximately 2.3 miles long). The pipeline will possess corrosion control/protective coating and connect the existing fuel transfer area to the bulk storage area. The project includes all mechanical, civil, electrical, architectural design and construction work to produce a complete and useable JP-8 fuel supply.

<u>Justification</u>: This project has not been authorized and appropriated. The Secretary of the Air Force, however, has determined that this project is vital to the protection and safety of service members operating at Al Dhafra AB and this project cannot be deferred for inclusion in the next Military Construction Authorization Act. As indicated in the March 5, 2009 Title 10 Section 2803 Emergency Construction notification, a permanent fuel pipeline is required to replace the continually failing expeditionary fuel pipeline. A permanent steel pipeline is required to transfer JP-8 fuel from the transfer area to the bulk storage area at Al Dhafra AB and support the Daily Demand Rate (DDR) of approximately 400 - 750 thousand gallons per day. This capability is required to sustain operations in support of USCENTCOM's major air refueling hub in the AOR.

Al Dhafra AB is a critical asset used by USCENTCOM for command and control, aerial refueling, and Intelligence, Surveillance and Reconnaissance (ISR) air operations in support of the Overseas Contingency Operations. Efficient and effective delivery of JP-8 fuel is critical to these operations. Currently JP-8 fuel is delivered to Al Dhafra AB via trucks downloaded at the off-base fuel transfer area and pumped through the expeditionary pipeline to the bulk storage area. The expeditionary pipeline has been in place since 2003, and lies directly on the corrosive soil or under water during high rainfalls, causing a persistent state of disrepair. The current work around requires fuels

personnel to drive the entire 2.3 miles twice daily constantly monitoring for pinholes, leaks and line coupling breaks. Since August 2006, there have been 24 fuel spills related to the expeditionary fuel storage and distribution system. Complete failure of this line is a major concern and replacement of this critical asset requires immediate attention.

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
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
