This reprogramming action is submitted for prior approval because it uses general transfer authority pursuant to section 8005 of Public Law 110-329, the Consolidated Security, Disaster Assistance, and Continuing Appropriations Act, 2009; and section 1001 of Public Law 110-417, the Duncan Hunter National Defense Authorization Act for Fiscal Year (FY) 2009. This action transfers \$10.0 million from the Defense Health Program, 09/09, appropriation to the Research, Development, Test, and Evaluation, Army, 09/10, appropriation to support suicide prevention and mitigation efforts in the Army. This action reprograms funding in support of higher priority items, based on unforeseen military requirements, than those for which originally appropriated; and is determined to be necessary in the national interest. It meets all administrative and legal requirements and none of the items has been previously denied by the Congress.
