Description: The reprogramming of Military Construction funding into Unspecified Minor Military Construction, Army (UMMCA) will enable correction of the accounts for an Anti-deficiency Act (ADA) violation (ADA Case 08-04). An ADA violation occurred within the Program Executive Office, Command, Control, and Communications Tactical (PEO C3T), Fort Monmouth, New Jersey, when FY 2004 and 2005 Operation and Maintenance, Army (OMA) funds and FY 2005 Research, Development, Test and Evaluation (RDTE) funds were obligated for the site preparation and installation for a modular building. The sum of the costs for the site preparation exceeded the threshold and should have been funded with unspecified minor military construction funds. This resulted in a violation of Title 31, United States Code, Section 1517, in the amount of \$1,276 thousand. Currently, only \$8 thousand is available in the FY 2004 UMMCA account to fund this requirement, therefore, reprogramming of \$1,268 thousand from major construction is requested.

<u>Justification</u>: This original project provided a Centralized Technical Support Facility (CTSF) at Fort Lewis, WA. During 2003, a need for CTSF infrastructure space was reported by (PEO C3T), Fort Monmouth, New Jersey, to the Fort Lewis garrison. As the functional proponent for this action, the Director of Public Works (DPW), Fort Lewis, identified a funding requirement of \$750,000. On December 23, 2003, the PEO C3T submitted to the DPW a \$750,000 FY 2004 Military Interdepartmental Purchase Request (MIPR) for the work. The sum of the costs for the site preparation first exceeded the

threshold on March 16, 2004, with the issuance of MIPR 4F4ALEW282. The MIPR was sent by PEO C3T to the Fort Lewis 1115th Signal Battalion, Department of Information Management (DOIM), for CTSF infrastructure costs (This MIPR was initially believed to be part of the unfunded costs of the project and not subject to the threshold.). Throughout the course of the violation, additional obligations were incurred for a total cost of \$1,276 thousand.

Description: The reprogramming of Military Construction funding into Unspecified Minor Military Construction, Army (UMMCA) will enable correction of the accounts for an Antideficiency Act (ADA) violation (ADA Case 08-08). An ADA violation occurred within the U.S. Army Test and Evaluation Command (ATEC), when FY 2006 Research, Development, Test and Evaluation (RDT&E) funds were obligated to build two prefabricated hangers at Condron Army Airfield (CAAF), White Sands Missile Range (WSMR), New Mexico. The cost of this modular construction project exceeded the unspecified minor military construction threshold and thus should have been funded with minor military construction funds. This resulted in a violation of Title 31, United States Code, Section 1517, in the amount of \$844 thousand. Currently, only \$42 thousand is available in the FY 2006 UMMCA account to fund this requirement, therefore, reprogramming of \$802 thousand from major construction is requested.

<u>Justification</u>: This original project provided Equipment Shrouds at CAAF, WSMR, New Mexico. The violation was identified during a walk through inspection with Installation Management Command, Department of Public Works, WSMR, on May 31, 2007. Beginning in late 2005 and proceeding through May 2006, individuals of the Business Development Group/WSMR and the Materiel Test Directorate (MTD)/WSTC actively sought to persuade the Extended Range/Multi-Purpose (ER/MP) "Warrior" Unmanned Aircraft System (UAS) Project Office to conduct the majority of its required testing at WSMR. Fundamental to achieving this decision, the WSMR personnel had to assure the

ER/MP "Warrior" product test manager and Project Manager, UAS, that suitable capabilities and facilities would be available at CAAF to satisfy the ER/MP logistical/maintenance support and test requirements. After receipt of preliminary requirements from the UAS Project Office, the Business Development Group/WSMR conducted a market survey of alternatives for the acquisition of a structure that could serve as a maintenance facility. By June 2006, the UAS Project Office had selected WSMR to be the location for a significant amount of testing for the ER/MP "Warrior" system.
