<u>Description</u>: This action will construct the company operations facilities and covered hardstand as authorized for this project.

Justification: This project supports the troop increase requested by the Secretary of Defense as part of the "Grow the Force" (GTF) initiative for the Army. The vehicle maintenance shop, organizational vehicle parking and deployment equipment storage facilities authorized for this project were awarded in April 2010. The company operations facilities and the covered hardstand could not be awarded as the award Current Working Estimate (CWE) for the full scope of this project based on contractors' proposals exceeded the Army's authority to award. The scope reduction notification for this project, dated April 5, 2010, indicated that the company operations facilities and covered hardstand were still required as originally requested and authorized. The new Combat Support/Combat Service Support quartermaster units located at Hunter Army Airfield will be negatively impacted if the company operations facilities and the covered hardstand are not constructed. There are no other facilities at the installation that can be used to perform this mission.

<u>Description</u>: This action will provide the fifth of five barracks and company operations facilities authorized as part of the Trainee Barracks Complex at Fort Benning, Georgia.

Justification: The requirement and authorized scope of this project is for five trainee barracks and company operations facilities, a battalion headquarters, and a dining facility to support the Initial Entry Combat training mission at Fort Benning. All of the facilities authorized for this project were awarded except for one of the barracks and company operations facilities. The fifth facility was not awarded due to market conditions resulting in higher costs for construction materials, labor, and fuel. At the time of award, no additional funds were available to reprogram for this facility. The Army decided it was important to award as much scope as possible to help meet the mission requirement to house and feed the additional companies of initial entry trainees at Fort Benning; however, without the fifth barracks and company operations facilities the full mission requirement will not be met. There are no other facilities at Fort Benning that can be used to perform this mission.

<u>Description</u>: This action will construct the brigade headquarters as authorized for the Grow the Force Combat Support/Combat Service Support units at Fort Bragg, North Carolina.

Justification: This project was authorized for the construction of company operations facilities, a battalion headquarters, and a brigade headquarters to support the Secretary of Defense's "Grow the Force" (GTF) initiative for the Army. All of the scope except for the brigade headquarters was awarded in September 2008. The brigade headquarters could not be awarded as the award Current Working Estimate (CWE) for the full scope of this project based on contractors' proposals exceeded the Army's authority to award. Proposals for this project were received in the summer of 2008 when market conditions drove costs higher than what was estimated due to the escalation in costs of construction materials, labor, and fuel. While the awarded work represents a complete and useable project, it does not fully meet the Army's mission requirements. The new Combat Support/Combat Service Support units located at Fort Bragg will be negatively impacted if the brigade headquarters is not constructed. There are no other facilities at the installation that can be used to perform the mission.

<u>Description</u>: The increase is needed to replace the roof of the existing building within which this project is being constructed. The Shoot House supports the training requirements of the West Virginia Army National Guard by allowing for the small arms familiarization and qualification of personnel training at Camp Dawson. There is no similar facility within the State or available within a reasonable distance (i.e., 2 hours) of Camp Dawson that meets this training requirement.

<u>Justification</u>: The roof replacement of the existing building within which this project is being constructed is necessary to protect the new construction being erected in the building, shoot house, and supporting administrative spaces. The poor condition of the existing roof was fully realized at the time of programming, and its replacement was part of the original scope of the project. Funding was insufficient to cover full replacement in the base bid, and thus, it was bid as an option to the project.

The Shoot House was originally appropriated at \$2.0 million; however, it was reduced to \$1.684 million due to the rescission under Section 130 of the Consolidated Appropriations Act of Fiscal Year 2010.

<u>Description</u>: The project will acquire two parcels of undeveloped land totaling 2,560 acres within the Target 101 Shade Tree Bombing Range, which is located within a five-minute flight-time from Naval Air Facility (NAF) El Centro. The acquisition includes all rights to the land including mineral and mining rights.

This project provides for the purchase of land currently being leased from private land owners and used in conjunction with other federally controlled lands as Navy bombing ranges. The Navy is seeking to acquire the property through condemnation, vice normal fee simple purchase, due to an inability to reach an agreement with the property owners on a fair market value. A small portion of the property is used for mining clay.

This land will be acquired through condemnation under the authority of 10 USC 2663 (d) "Land Acquisition Authorities," which permits the acquisition of interests in land when the need is urgent. The Secretary of the Navy must determine that this land is needed in the interest of national defense to maintain the operational integrity of NAF El Centro. Appropriations available for military construction may be used for this purpose.

<u>Justification</u>: The Navy entered into a lease for the subject property in 1968. Negotiations with the owners for renewal of the lease ended in 2006. The parcels of land are currently secured under leasehold per a 2007 condemnation action. Due to a recent court order, it is probable that the Navy will be forced to vacate the property and cease training activities at Target 101 unless fee title to the parcels is acquired.

Aircrews use the ranges at NAF El Centro to develop their skills including air-to-ground bombing. Target 101 is the second most used Navy bombing target in the U.S. with an average

of 3,000 sorties per year. The Navy has used this isolated, unencroached, perfect-weather target area since 1968 and has a long-term requirement for its continued, heavy use.

The land identified in this acquisition project is comprised of two parcels of land (52-A and 52-C) that are within the inert bombing range safety zone area. Loss of this target, which represents 30 percent of El Centro's air-to-ground target capacity, would increase the demand on other targets beyond their capacities. The loss of training at Target 101 would result in loss of aircrew training opportunities, thereby significantly affecting squadron operational readiness.
