Some adjustments in this reprogramming impact the Military Intelligence Program (MIP) and are initiatives supported by the Secretary of Defense's Intelligence, Surveillance, and Reconnaissance (ISR) Task Force (TF). Commander, International Security Assistance Force and Commander, U.S Forces in Afghanistan recently identified these programs as critical priorities for U.S. Forces in Afghanistan.

<u>Part I</u> of this reprogramming action transfers \$180.8 million among various appropriations. This reprogramming action uses \$180.8 million of general transfer authority pursuant to section 101 of Public Law 111-322, Continuing Appropriations Resolution, 2011; section 1001 of Public Law 111-383, the National Defense Authorization Act for Fiscal Year (FY) 2011; and section 8005 of Public Law 111-118, Department of Defense Appropriations Act, 2010.

<u>Part II</u> transfers \$122.0 million among various Defense appropriations. This reprogramming action uses \$122.0 million in general transfer authority pursuant to section 8005 of Public Law 111-118, the Department of Defense (DoD) Appropriations Act, 2010; and section 1001 of Public Law 111-84, the National Defense Authorization Act for Fiscal Year (FY) 2010.

Explanation: Funding is available because the Army, after a thorough review, has decided that it no longer needs to buy new HMMWVs. The HMMWV has demonstrated that it cannot survive in a battlefield situation that involves improved explosive devices and other lethal threats. As a result, the Army has concluded that it has all the HMMWVs that are required. The Army does plan to recapitalize portions of its existing fleet for use in circumstances where they are survivable, but it does not plan to buy any new vehicles. This is Overseas Contingency Operations (OCO) funding. This is a congressional special interest item.
