This reprogramming action is submitted for prior approval in accordance with established procedures for reprogramming under section 1001 of the National Defense Authorization Act (NDAA) for Fiscal Year (FY) 2013 (Public Law 112-239). This reprogramming action provides funding in support of higher priority items based on unforeseen military requirements, than those for which originally appropriated; and are determined to be necessary in the national interest. They meet all administrative and legal requirements, and none of the items have previously been denied by the Congress.

This reprogramming action transfers \$45.2 million from the Operation and Maintenance, Defense-Wide, 14/14, appropriation to the Global Security Contingency Fund, 12/15, appropriation. This reprogramming uses \$45.2 million of special transfer authority pursuant to section 8068 of division C of Public Law 113-76, the Department of Defense Appropriations Act, 2014, and is in accordance with section 1207 of Public Law 112-81, the National Defense Authorization Act for FY 2012.

FY 2014 REPROGRAMMING INCREASE: **+45,200**

Global Security Contingency Fund, 12/15 **+45,200**

Explanation: Funds are required for the following:

- \$+30.0 million is required to assist the Governments of Cameroon, Chad, Niger, and Nigeria develop institutional and tactical capabilities to enhance their respective efforts to counter Boko Haram, and to lay the ground work for increased cross-border cooperation to counter Boko Haram.
- \$+15.2 million is required to assist Ukraine, through the provision of technical expertise, training, and equipment, to develop four Ukrainian National Guard companies for one tactical headquarters capable of conducting internal defense operations.

FY 2014 REPROGRAMMING DECREASE: **-45,200**

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Explanation: Funds are available from the Global Security Contingency Fund (\$30.0 million) and funds authorized under the Global Train and Equip program (\$15.2 million) (section 1206 of Public Law 109-163, the National Defense Authorization Act for FY 2006, as amended) due to higher priority requirements. This is base budget funding.
