This reprogramming action transfers a total of \$206.282 million, in two parts, from various appropriations back to the Counterterrorism Partnerships Fund, 16/17, appropriation pursuant to the Department of Defense (DoD) Appropriations Act, 2016 (division C of Public Law 114-113) under the heading "Counterterrorism Partnerships Fund," and section 1534(d)(5) of Public Law 113-291, the Carl Levin and Howard P. "Buck" McKeon National Defense Authorization Act for FY 2015.

Part I of this reprogramming action transfers \$16.483 million from the Operation and Maintenance, Defense-Wide, 16/16, appropriations back to the Counterterrorism Partnerships Fund (CTPF), 16/17, appropriation. This funding was intended to provide assistance to appropriately vetted elements of the Syrian opposition and other appropriately vetted Syrian groups and individuals.

Part II of this reprogramming action transfers \$189.799 million from the Operation and Maintenance, Defense-Wide, 16/16, appropriation back to the CTPF, 16/17, appropriation. This funding was intended to provide support and assistance to foreign security forces to conduct counterterrorism activities under the Authority to Build the Capacity of Foreign Security Forces (10 USC 2282).

This reprogramming is required due to timing of operational activities supporting the vetted Syrian opposition for continued assistance to appropriately vetted elements of the Syrian opposition and other appropriately vetted Syrian groups and individuals as authorized by section 9016 of division C of the Public Law 113-235, the DoD Appropriations Act, 2015 and section 1209 of Public Law 113-291, the Carl Levin and Howard P. "Buck" McKeon National Defense Authorization Act for FY 2015, as amended. These are Title IX OCO budget funding
