This reprogramming action transfers funds appropriated in Title III of division B of Public Law 116-136, the Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security Act (CARES Act), to other applicable appropriations of the Department of Defense pursuant to section 13001 of such Title. The reprogramming provides funding for expenses to prevent, prepare for, or respond to the coronavirus. This reprogramming action meets all administrative and legal requirements, and none of the items have been previously denied by the Congress.

This reprogramming action transfers or realigns \$24.417 million between Fiscal Year (FY) 2020 Army appropriations using transfer authority conferred by section 13001 of Title III of division B of Public Law 116-136, the CARES Act. In addition, it realigns \$0.862 million within the Military Personnel, Navy appropriation.

Explanation: Funds are required to assess COVID-19 testing capability for the operational Army force. Army training and operations during COVID-19 require a fast and efficient testing process to potentially minimize operational disruptions. These funds will be used to evaluate the viability and reliability of two systems for COVID-19 testing in operations settings: GeneXpert Omni Point of Care and Cue Health. Operational evaluation of these systems will assess viability for addressing point-of-care testing gaps within the Joint Services. Highly sensitive point of care diagnostic testbed is expected to provide results in 25 minutes. This is a CARES Act division B, Title III, requirement.
