<u>Project Description</u>: This project provides a 6-bay hangar for an F-35A squadron. It will include space for low observable material maintenance, engine maintenance, gun maintenance, storage, office and ancillary spaces.

<u>Justification</u>: Since the award of the design contract, the construction industry has experienced increased competition and limited subcontractor availability. The prime contractor reports difficulty obtaining subcontractor bids because off-base opportunities are more competitive and less logistically constrained. Building materials and fuel costs have increased. Contractors in the United Kingdom are also adding a risk cost factor due to the uncertainty around the potential impact on trade agreements, material shipping from the EU, and overall pricing because of BREXIT. In total, these cost increases have resulted in higher costs than estimated, especially relating to mechanical, electrical and plumbing systems.

This project's electrical, communications, and utilities infrastructure requirements increased as a result of miscalculated infrastructure demands from new adjacent facilities during project development. Additionally, cost increases resulted in facility mechanical and electrical systems, internal finishes, and external works, including newly identified demolition requirements. Also, the Host Nation's construction agent required additional contingency funds and departmental expenses. Finally, an additional schedule delay period of 10 months was included to cover the contractor's extended overhead and site logistics costs.

A 10 USC §2853 notification dated March 31, 2020 was submitted to Congress.
