<u>Project Description</u>: This project provides two 10,000-barrel aboveground fuel storage tanks, a pump shelter with two 600 gallon-per-minute issue/transfer pumps and two 600 gallon-per-minute filter separators. Work includes all necessary fuel piping, product recovery tank, control systems, secondary containment, site work, utility connections, fencing with gates, security lighting, temporary tanks during construction, demolition of two 100,000-gallon concrete cut and cover tanks and remediation of fuel-contaminated soil funded by another appropriation.

<u>Justification</u>: An additional \$6.9 million is required to complete this project and provide a complete and useable facility that meets mission requirements. The cost increase is due to the following:

- Execution delay/market condition changes (\$5.3 million): The original contract was broken into multiple efforts. The demolition and environmental remediation portion of the project was not awarded until September 2018 due to delays in finalizing the project design. The demolition and environmental effort required two years to complete before the new construction portion of the project could be awarded. In addition to the execution delay, costs increased due to an escalation in material prices and labor costs in the region during this timeframe as a result of the major commercial, residential, industrial, and utility projects in Florida. Greater material prices in steel adversely affect this project due to the large amounts required, and increased demand for skilled subcontractors have extended the market outside of the local commuting area which also increases labor costs.
- Contingency and Supervision, Inspection, and Overhead (SIOH) (\$1.6 million): Increases are directly associated with higher construction costs.
