- \$+0.5 million to maintain and update the Congressional Hearings and Reporting Requirements Tracking System (CHARRTS), which facilitates communication between Congress and DoD, and timely DoD responses to Congressional RFI. This is a congressional special interest item. This is a base budget requirement.
- \$+3.5 million to support the Independent Review Commission (IRC) on Sexual Assault in the Military addresses the immediate priority of the President and the Secretary of Defense. The IRC will ensure that an independent, impartial assessment is prepared. The High Risk Installation (HRI) Evaluation Study will generate the HRI Reports on an enduring basis quarterly reports to the Secretary. Enduring efforts also include establishment of a Violence Prevention Workforce, as well as implementation of the IRC's Final Report Recommendations to the President and Secretary. This is a must-pay requirement to meet one of the Administration's top defense priorities, and will improve unit cohesion, morale, and force readiness. This is a base budget requirement.
