This reprogramming action transfers the \$50.0 million appropriated in section 202 of Title II of Public Law 117-128, the Additional Ukraine Supplemental Appropriations Act, 2022, to the Research, Development, Test and Evaluation, Defense-Wide appropriation for execution. This reprogramming action provides funding to develop program protection strategies for Department of Defense systems identified for possible future export, to design and incorporate exportability features into such systems during the research and development phases of such systems, and to integrate design features that enhance interoperability of such systems with those of friendly foreign countries.

The reprogramming action transfers \$50.0 million from Operation and Maintenance, Defense-Wide to RDT&E, Defense-Wide, which will then be made available for the Lower Tier Air and Missile Defense Sensor radar system. This action is determined to be necessary in the national interest. This reprogramming action meets all administrative and legal requirements, and none of the items have been previously denied by the Congress.

The transfer authority provided by section 202 is in addition to any other transfer authority available to the Department of Defense.
