This reprogramming action transfers funds between appropriations for proper execution. The reclassification is required to execute funds properly in accordance with congressional intent. These actions are determined to be necessary in the national interest. These actions do not change the purpose for which the funds were originally appropriated. This reprogramming action meets all administrative and legal requirements, and none of the items has been previously denied by the Congress.

This reprogramming action transfers \$17.575 million between Defense appropriations pursuant to section 8132 of division C of Public Law 116-260, the Department of Defense (DoD) Appropriations Act, 2021. Section 8132 appropriated \$100.0 million for transfer to appropriations for operation and maintenance; procurement; and research, development, test and evaluation to assess and strengthen the manufacturing and defense industrial base and supply chain resiliency. The transfer authority provided by Section 8132 is in addition to any other transfer authority available to the Department of Defense.

Explanation: Funds are required to assess and strengthen the domestic industrial base and supply chain for Printed Circuit Boards (PrCBs), the domestic production of which has declined 90 percent since 1980 primarily due to the predatory tactics of China. Funds will support initiatives to develop domestic PrCB manufacturing capability/capacity to maintain advanced U.S. military superiority. Section 2533d of Title 10, United States Code, repealed by section 1881(a) of the National Defense Authorization Act for Fiscal Year 2021, Public Law 116-283, had restricted DoD acquisition of certain PrCBs from North Korea, the Peoples Republic of China, the Russian Federation and the Islamic Republic of Iran. Efforts will focus on enabling the domestic PrCB industrial base to keep pace with the technical advances of microelectronics devices, delivering advanced manufacturing processes and materials for domestic production of packaging at very finite feature sizes, and providing domestic production capacity for organic substrates. This is a congressional special interest item.
