<u>Project Description</u>: This project constructs a new laboratory facility to include a high-performance computing data center, laboratories, a remote telescope operations center, administrative spaces, conference center, warehouse functions, a security entry control point, and a controlled area.

<u>Justification</u>: The project cost increase is due primarily from the extraordinary impacts of the Maui wildfires of August 2023. Sharply higher labor costs resulted from a shortage of available local labor, necessitating a significant off-island labor force that must largely be transported daily to and from Maui due to a severe shortage of transient housing on the island. Heightened demand for construction materials along with fluctuating prices is making suppliers hesitant to commit to pricing for the long bid expiration period, which has increased pricing due to the associated risk.

<u>Project Description</u>: This project constructs a 57,596 square-meter aircraft parking apron with supporting shoulders, taxiway, and hydrant refueling system to accommodate six B-52 bomber aircraft in support of bilateral Enhance Air Cooperation missions. The project includes jet blast deflectors, site improvements, utilities, and removal of existing pavement.

Justification: The project cost increase is due to the high demand for construction in the market area, workforce logistics issues, and significant risks associated with material prices. A surge in the number of projects in the Northern Territory of Australia is driving a high demand for labor resulting in increased costs to attract and retain laborers. Due to the remote location, workforce accommodation is a large cost item at Tindal. The limited worker accommodation in the nearby town of Katherine is at capacity, driving higher prices for the contractor's temporary worker facilities/lodging and other accommodations. Increased demand for construction materials along with fluctuating prices is making suppliers hesitant to commit to pricing for the long bid expiration period, resulting in escalated pricing to mitigate risk.

<u>Project Description</u>: This project constructs an Equipment Concentration Site consisting of a tactical equipment maintenance facility, general purpose warehouse, and organizational parking directly supporting the equipment readiness of Army Reserve units assigned within the state of Florida.

<u>Justification</u>: The cost increase is attributed to unforeseen site conditions and design errors and omissions. The roof of the existing warehouse to be renovated was found in worse condition than expected which necessitated a full replacement. The utility permit review identified deficiencies in the proposed storm water management system requiring re-design of the system as well as the foundation of the Tactical Equipment Maintenance Facility due to increased water flow, resulting in additional cost and schedule delay. Correction of design errors also required increasing the size of exterior lighting bases and poles and increasing the depth of pavement in the military equipment parking area at greater cost. The Army is evaluating these design errors and omissions for potential claims against the designer of record.

A 10 U.S.C. §2853 cost variation notification dated May 30, 2024, was submitted to the Congress.

<u>Project Description</u>: This project constructs a 10,500 SF indoor small arms range and 1,800 SF Combat Arms Training and Maintenance Facility with Automatic Target Rail System. The facility will house a modular containerized small arms training set and a combat arms training and maintenance facility to provide classroom training space, administrative space, and arms cleaning and inspection areas.

<u>Justification</u>: The project cost increased due to historic general economic inflation and enduring price escalation resulting from supply chain disruption and material and labor shortages.
