This prior approval reprogramming action is submitted for approval because these actions use general or special transfer authority, exceed established reprogramming thresholds, affect special interest items, or initiate a new start. This reprogramming action provides funding in support of higher priority items, based on unforeseen military requirements, than those for which originally appropriated; and are determined to be necessary in the national interest. They meet all administrative and legal requirements, and none of the items have previously been denied by the Congress.

PART I of this reprogramming action transfers \$116.086 million between Defense appropriations. This reprogramming action uses \$116.086 million of general transfer authority pursuant to section 8005 of division A of Public Law 118-47, the Department of Defense Appropriations Act, 2024, and section 1001 of Public Law 118-31, the National Defense Authorization Act for Fiscal Year (FY) 2024.

PART II of this reprogramming action transfers \$356.658 million between Defense appropriations. This reprogramming action uses \$356.658 million of special transfer authority pursuant to section 101 in division B of Public Law 118-50, the Ukraine Security Supplemental Appropriations Act, 2024. Further, this part realigns \$178.299 million within the same appropriation. The transfer authority provided in Public Law 118-50 is in addition to any other transfer authority available to the Department of Defense.
