<u>Installation</u>: Naval Station Norfolk, Virginia

Project: Submarine Pier 3 (Inc.)

Authorization: National Defense Authorization Act (NDAA) for Fiscal Year (FY) 2022,

<u>Project Description</u>: This project constructs a new berthing pier and new berthing wharf to support the Los Angeles Class and Virginia Class submarines. Construction includes dredging, demolition of two inadequate piers, and building of a utility service facility.

<u>Justification</u>: Technical solution changes in requirements after project design resulted in a change to the type of berthing camels to allow additional clearance between the submarine stern diving planes and the face of the fender piles. Changes to the electrical substations were required to provide the proper switching, lockout panels, and maintenance spacing. An additional change to the deck drainage and the pier deck soffit was modified to meet both Department of Defense and State of Virginia criteria for a 10-year rain event.

Unforeseen conditions include changes to contaminated water disposal, underwater debris removal, removal of undocumented piles, and additional cable splicing to avoid damaging high value cables during installation.

The technical solution changes and unforeseen conditions caused schedule delays resulting in Government responsibility at an estimated overhead rate for the additional time at approximately \$22,000 per day to address these changes.
