Explanation: Funds are required to accelerate production of small, unmanned surface vehicles to meet an ideal delivery date of August 2025, and to address cost increases above the FY 2025 President's Budget request of \$220 million for the production of Small unmanned surface vehicles. Additional classified details will be provided under separate cover. This funding will procure 116 of the originally planned 300 vehicles. The contract is ready to be awarded as soon as funds are received to sustain an accelerated rate of production. This need is to support efforts of a classified battle plan congruent with Navy missions to combat a high priority threat. This is a new start. The total cost of this requirement is \$354.854 million, and the remaining \$220.0 million is requested in the FY 2025 President's Budget. This is a congressional special interest item.
