#### Note 1.

#### **Significant Accounting Policies**

#### 1.A. Basis of Presentation

The Department of Defense (DoD) Medicare-Eligible Retiree Health Care Fund (hereby referred to as the Fund) was authorized by Public Law (PL) 106-398 for the accumulation of funds to finance the liabilities of the DoD and the uniformed services health care programs for specific Medicare-eligible beneficiaries.

These financial statements have been prepared to report the financial position and results of operations for the Fund, as required by the Chief Financial Officers (CFO) Act of 1990, expanded by the Government Management Reform Act (GMRA) of 1994, and other appropriate legislation. The financial statements have been prepared from the books and records of the Trust Fund Accounting Division, Accounting Directorate, Defense Finance and Accounting Service, in accordance with the requirements of Office of Management and Budget (OMB) Circular No. A-136, "Financial Reporting Requirements," and accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America. The Fund financial statements, in addition to the financial reports, are prepared by DFAS pursuant to OMB directives, which are used to monitor and control budgetary resources within the fund.

Detailed explanations of these financial statement elements are discussed in applicable footnotes.

#### 1.B. Mission of the Reporting Entity

The mission of the Fund is to accumulate funds in order to finance, on an actuarially sound basis, liabilities of the DoD and the uniformed services health care programs for specific Medicare-eligible beneficiaries.

The asset accounts used to prepare the statements are categorized as either entity or non-entity assets, where applicable. Entity accounts consist of resources that the agency has the authority to use or where management is legally obligated to use funds to meet entity obligations. Non-entity accounts are assets that are held by an entity but are not available for use in the operations of the entity.

#### 1.C. Appropriations and Funds

The Fund was authorized by the "Floyd D. Spence National Defense Authorization Act for Fiscal Year 2001." The purpose of this Fund is to pay the costs of all Military Service and uniformed service retiree health care programs for members or former members of a participating service who are entitled to retired or retainer pay and are Medicare-eligible, their dependents who are Medicare-eligible, and survivors who are Medicare-eligible.

The Fund appropriations are designated as special funds. These appropriations are used to fund the daily execution of the Fund mission.

The Fund is classified as a special fund and uses both receipt and expenditure accounts. The Fund symbol is 97X5472. The account uses a budget activity level structure. Lower level accounts are established as necessary to meet reporting requirements.

Effective FY 2006, quarter 1, the Fund started reporting its financial position and results of operations using the term "Earmarked Funds." Earmarked Funds are financed by specifically identified revenues, required by statute to be used for designated activities, benefits or purposes, and remain available over time. Earmarked funds also have a requirement to account for and report on the receipt, use and retention of revenues and other financing sources that distinguish it from general revenues.

#### 1.D. Basis of Accounting

Under authority of the CFO Act of 1990, the Federal Accounting Standards Advisory Board (FASAB) was established to recommend Federal Accounting Standards to the Secretary of the Treasury, the Director of the OMB, the Director of the Office of Personnel Management and the Comptroller General. The Statements of Federal Financial Accounting Standards (SFFAS) have been issued by the Director of the OMB and the Comptroller General, some of which have deferred effective dates.

In April 2000, the American Institute of Certified Public Accountants (AICPA), via its Statements on Auditing Standards (SAS) No. 69, *The Meaning of Present Fairly in Conformity with Generally Accepted Accounting Principles (GAAP) in the Auditor's Report*, as amended by SAS No. 91, established the following hierarchy of accounting principles for federal government entities.

- (A) FASAB Statements and Interpretations plus AICPA and Financial Accounting Standards Board (FASB) pronouncements if made applicable to Federal governmental entities by a FASAB Statement or Interpretation

In the absence of a pronouncement covered by Federal generally accepted accounting principles (GAAP) or another source of established accounting principles, the auditor of a federal government entity may consider other accounting literature, depending on its relevance to the circumstance. When directed by OMB, through OMB Circular No. A-136, GAAP in the United States of America serve as authoritative guidance for federal agencies in preparing reports that are addressed within this circular.

#### 1.E. Revenues and Other Financing Sources

Financing sources for the Fund are provided primarily through an annual unfunded actuarial liability payment from Treasury, monthly contributions from the Military Services and other Uniformed Services (United States Coast Guard, the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration, and the United States Public Health Service), and interest earned on investments. The monthly contributions are calculated by multiplying the monthly per capita rates (full time and part time) provided by the DoD Office of the Actuary by the reported end strength for the most recently reported month. However, beginning in FY 2006, the Military Services and other Uniformed Services stopped making normal cost payments monthly. Instead, the Treasury now includes one lump sum cost payment for the entire year, on behalf of these contributors, in its annual amortization payment of the unfunded liability. This payment is made at the beginning of each fiscal year.

#### 1.F. Recognition of Expenses

For financial reporting purposes, DoD policy requires the recognition of benefit expenses in the period incurred.

#### 1.G. Accounting for Intragovernmental Activities

The Fund purchases and redeems non-marketable market-based securities issued by the United States Treasury, Bureau of Public Debt. Non-marketable market-based securities include Treasury bills, notes, bonds, Treasury Inflation-Protected Securities (TIPS), and overnight certificates. Treasury bills are short-term securities with maturities of 1 year or less and are

purchased at a discount. Treasury notes have maturities of at least 1 year, but not more than 10 years, and are purchased at a discount or premium. Treasury bonds are long-term securities with maturity terms of 10 years or more and are purchased at either a discount or premium.

The Fund records investments at book value on the trial balance in SGL 1600, Investments, Net.. Discounts and premiums are recorded on the trial balances in SGL 1611, Discount on US Treasury Securities Issued by Public Debt; and 1612, Premium on US Treasury Securities Issued by Public Debt; respectively. The Fund calculates amortization of discounts and premiums using the effective interest method and records this amortization on the trial balance in SGL 1613, Amortized Discount/Premium, US Treasury Securities Issued by Public Debt.

The Fund receives interest on the value of its non-marketable market-based securities from Treasury on a semi-annual basis for U.S. Treasury bonds and notes.

#### 1.I. Funds with the U.S. Treasury

The U.S. Treasury allows the Fund to be fully invested. Therefore, the Fund Balance with Treasury (FBWT) may be zero during various quarters of the fiscal year.

Fund financial resources are maintained in U.S. Treasury Accounts. The Defense Finance and Accounting Service (DFAS) Denver processes all fund receipts and adjustments. DFAS-Denver prepares monthly reports, which provide information to the U.S. Treasury on transfers and deposits.

In addition, DFAS-Denver submits reports to Treasury, by appropriation, on collections received. Treasury then records this information in the FBWT account maintained in the Treasury system. Differences between the Fund recorded balance in the FBWT account and the Treasury FBWT are reconciled.

The Office of Management and Budget advised that certain U.S. Standard General Ledger accounts are inconsistent with the budget presentations for certain Special and Trust Fund Receipts. The increase in Net Investments from \$55,284,600 thousand in FY 2005 to \$87,475,115 thousand in FY 2006 represents contributions in excess of beneficiary payments, accrued interest earned and a change in the normal cost funding methodology in FY 2006. Beginning in FY 2006, the Military Services and other Uniformed Services stopped making normal cost payments monthly. Instead, Treasury makes one lump sum payment on behalf of these contributors, for normal cost for the entire year at the beginning of the year which increased investments in the first quarter. Note: Treasury Inflation-Protected Securities, or TIPS, provide protection against inflation. The principal of a TIPS increases with inflation and decreases with deflation, as measured by the Consumer Price Index. When a TIPS matures, Treasury pays the adjusted principal or original principal, whichever is greater.

The investments for FY 2006, quarter 1, include an investment of \$4,500,000 thousand in Treasury Bills. These nonmarketable, market-based securities are short-term securities with maturities of 1 year or less and are purchased at a discount. The investment strategy has changed to better match the maturities of the investments to the timing of the cash flows.

Contributions to the Medicare-Eligible Retiree Health Care Fund (the Fund) are calculated to maintain the Fund on an actuarially sound basis. This process means that there will be sufficient funds to make all covered payments on behalf of eligible beneficiaries each year, and that the Fund balance is projected to eventually equal the actuarial liability, i.e., all unfunded liabilities are liquidated. In order to accomplish this objective, normal costs are calculated to fully fund the current year projected liability for active duty members and reservists. In addition, amortization payments are calculated to fund liabilities that were present at the Fund's inception (initial unfunded) and any emerging actuarial gains or losses. The initial unfunded liability of the program is being amortized over a 50-year period. All subsequent gains and losses experienced by the system are amortized over a 30-year period. Methods and assumptions used to compute actuarial costs and liabilities, and to amortize the initial unfunded liability as well as all actuarial gains and losses, must be approved by the Department of Defense Medicare-Eligible Retiree Health Care Board of Actuaries. This approval is required by Chapter 56 of Title 10, United States Code. The Board is a Federal Advisory Committee appointed by the Secretary of Defense.

#### **Intragovernmental**

The \$43,105 thousand in Intragovernmental receivables was a result of the Army Reserve underpaying its normal cost contribution for September 2005. This discrepancy was not discovered until the FY 2005 financial statements had been published. Management believes that the effects of this uncorrected financial statement misstatement of accounts receivable at the close of FY 2005 is immaterial and so stated this fact in the Management Representation Letter to the auditors, dated November 7, 2005. We expect this receivable to be recouped during the second quarter of FY 2006.

#### Non-Federal

Non-Federal Accounts Receivable increased \$1,984 thousand (27 percent). The increase is due primarily to the fiscal intermediary (Wisconsin Physician Service) identifying additional erroneous payments, recording/reporting the accounts receivable, and placing the beneficiary/provider on offset in its claims processing system. Also, approximately \$1.9 million of the \$10.0 million of the total accounts receivable represent current accounts receivable due to the Fund from the TRICARE Mail Order Pharmacy (TMOP) contractor (Express Scripts) for co-payments made by Medicare-eligible beneficiaries for generic drugs (\$3/script) and band-name drugs (\$9/script). These co-payments are made by beneficiaries to Express Scripts at the time they order their prescription refills through the TMOP. Express Scripts then refunds to the government those co-payments at a later date. This particular account has increased slightly over the past several years due to a slight increase in the demand for pharmaceuticals through the TMOP program.

In the table below, the non-delinquent and delinquent amounts through 180 days are held by the TRICARE Dual Eligible Fiscal Intermediary Contractor (TDEFIC) per contract requirements. The TDEFIC holds these accounts and tries to recoup the receivables from the providers. If the TDEFIC has not received payment by the time it gets another claim from that particular provider, the TDEFIC deducts the amount owed the government in the accounts receivable (AR) from the amount owed on the new claim, pays the difference, and closes out the receivable. Once the accounts age to 180 days, the larger debts, totaling at least \$600, are transferred to TMA General Counsel for review and transfer to Treasury. Accounts that are less than \$600 are held by the TDEFIC contractor for the life of the contract. The contractor continues to pursue collection or claims offset. When the contract is awarded to a new contractor, these AR are transferred to that contractor for appropriate collection action.

The Allowance for Estimated Uncollectibles is calculated as a percentage (3 percent) of receivables from all sources. The majority of the receivables are held by the TDEFIC. The allowance for uncollectible accounts is based on an analysis of the actual uncollectible amounts experienced during FY 2004 and the first 3 quarters of FY 2005.

Line 2E, Other Liabilities, increased \$278,560 thousand in FY 2006, quarter 1, because of the increase in the Incurred But Not Reported (IBNR) costs. The rationale for the increase is discussed in Footnote 15. Beginning with the September 30, 2005, year-end reporting, it was determined that the IBNR costs were not Other Unfunded Employment-Related Liabilities; therefore, the Fund reclassified the IBNR costs to Other Accrued Liabilities to accurately classify the liability.

#### Nonfederal

The increase in the non-federal accounts payable is due to an understatement of accounts payable in early FY 2005 and an overstatement of the FY 2005 undelivered orders. This situation resulted from the backlog of health care claims processing through the new claims record (TRICARE Encounter Data System – TEDS). The backlog occurred because the TRICARE Management Activity (TMA) converted from the old claims record, Health Care Service Record (HCSR), to TEDS. Processing problems with the TEDS records were not corrected until early second quarter of FY 2005, which resulted in a backlog of claims records not being eliminated until the third quarter of FY 2005.

In line 2A, the \$491,344 thousand (100 percent) decrease in Accrued Funded Payroll and Benefits is due to the recording of Incurred But Not Reported (IBNR) costs as Other Accrued Liabilities beginning in 4th Quarter, 2005. These amounts were previously recorded as Other Unfunded Employment Related Liabilities. The IBNR costs are not unfunded and, therefore, were reclassified to Other Accrued Liabilities, which is line 2I.

In line 2I, Other Liabilities, the current IBNR liabilities increased \$278,560 thousand from FY 2005, quarter 1 to FY 2006, quarter 1. The explanation of this fluctuation is not available because there was no IBNR estimate for FY 2005, quarter 1 due to a system issue. However, this increase can be partially attributed to the change between FY 2005, quarter 4 and FY 2006, quarter 1 for the following reasons:

- 1. \$42,277 thousand an expected increase due to medical cost trends.
- 2. \$8,970 thousand an increase due to the improvement of the Care-End date versus Care-Beginning date assumption process. In addition, the IBNR reserve increased \$9 thousand.
- 3. \$28,111 thousand an increase due to a residual change in methodology. This is the equivalent of the gain/loss component of a change in actuarial liability. There are hundreds of factors and assumptions that come into play, and it is impossible to quantify every reason for change. However, the general reason for the increase in the residual change in methodology can be attributed to increases in the utilization of medical services and changes in incurred vs. paid claims patterns observed during the first quarter of FY 2006.
- 4. (\$71,616 thousand) a decrease due to an acceptance date versus processes date adjustment added as a result of adjusting paid claims in the Legacy triangles, Board of Actuaries' spreadsheets, and tying to the accounting reports. This revision to the purchased care claims triangles ties future adjustments to already paid claims to the month and year in which the adjustment was made rather than back to the month and year in which the claim was initially paid.

Each year the actuarial liability is expected to increase with normal cost, decrease with benefit payments, and increase with the interest cost. In the absence of actuarial gains and losses or benefit changes, an increase of \$35,696,641 thousand in the actuarial liability was expected during FY 2005 (line b plus line c plus line d). The September 30, 2005, actuarial liability includes changes due to new assumptions and actuarial experience. The actuarial loss due to new medical trend assumptions is \$12,529,304 thousand (line f). The actuarial gains and losses due to other factors (net - \$14,902,660 thousand, line e) includes new population data, other actuarial experience being different from assumed and actuarial assumption changes other than the change in trend assumptions.

Intragovermental Gross Costs represent the distribution of funds from the MERHCF to the military treatment facilities (MTFs) for care provided to Medicare-eligible uniformed service beneficiaries in our MTFs. The increase of \$136,752 thousand is attributable to increased ambulatory pharmacy use and increases in actual costs per encounter for inpatient, outpatient and pharmacy care/services. Demand for inpatient and outpatient services has remained relatively constant since the Fund's inception. Demand for ambulatory pharmacy services has increased each year since FY 2003. The increase in pharmacy services is due to a combination of an increase in the number of users and an increase in average demand per user.

Line 1, above reflects the total contributions from the Military Services plus the U.S. Public Health Service, U.S. Coast Guard, and National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration, known collectively as the Uniformed Services. These contributions also include an accounts receivable owed by the Army Reserves in the amount of \$43,105 thousand as reflected in note 5.

The Uniformed Services contributions increased \$8,622,946 thousand from FY 2005 to FY 2006. This fluctuation is primarily due to a change in policy that required upfront annual contributions rather than monthly contributions. This fluctuation also includes an increase in normal cost contribution rates provided by the Board of Actuaries.

Line 2, U.S. Treasury Annual Unfunded Liability Payment, increased \$891,000 thousand from FY 2005 to FY 2006 due to the computation furnished by the Board of Actuaries. The FY 2005 Defense Authorization Act assigns Treasury, vice the Uniformed Services, the responsibility of paying normal cost contributions into the Fund, starting in FY 2006.

Line 3, Interest on Investments, increased \$918,900 thousand from FY 2005 to FY 2006. This fluctuation is primarily due to the large increase in contributions received in October 2005 and the compounding effect of higher rates of return.

Public Earned Revenue represents accounts receivable. From the close of FY 2005, quarter 4, through the close of FY 2006, quarter 1, accounts receivable decreased \$1,579 thousand. During FY 2006, quarter 1, the TRICARE Dual Eligible Fiscal Intermediary Contractor (TDEFIC) aggressively pursued collections of \$5,500 thousand while it identified only \$3,900 thousand in new accounts receivable.

Gross Costs with the Public increased \$243,945 thousand due to the following reasons:

- 1) An increase in payments to the daily Purchased Care Operations and Maintenance of \$236,529 thousand.
- 2) An increase in the change of Incurred But Not Reported (IBNR) payables of \$7,741 thousand. This increase represents the net difference in the fourth quarter FY 2005 IBNR change of \$270,819 thousand, and the fourth quarter FY 2004 IBNR change of \$236,432 thousand.
- 3) An increase in Allowance for Estimated Uncollectible of \$301 thousand.
- 4) A decrease in Accounts Receivables of \$626 thousand.

<sup>1.</sup> A description of the fund's purpose, how the component accounts for and reports the fund, and its authority to use those revenue, and other financing sources.

The purpose of the Medicare-Eligible Retiree Health Care Fund (MERHCF) fund is to accumulate funds to finance, on an actuarially sound basis, liabilities of the Department of Defense and the uniformed services health care programs for specific Medicare-eligible beneficiaries.

The MERHCF was authorized by Public Law 106-398. The Fund appropriations are designated as special funds. These appropriations are used to fund the daily execution of the Fund mission. The Fund is classified as a special fund and uses both receipt and expenditure accounts. The account uses a budget activity level structure and establishes lower level accounts as necessary to meet reporting requirements.

The Fund prepares financial statements to report the financial position and results of operations as required by the Chief Financial Officers Act of 1990, which was expanded by the Government Management Reform Act of 1994.

2. The sources of revenue or other financing for the period and an explanation of the extent to which they are inflows or resources to the Department.

Financing sources for the MERHCF, which are inflows only to the Fund, are provided primarily through an annual unfunded actuarial liability payment from Treasury, annual contribution(s) from the Military Services and other Uniformed Services (US Coast Guard, the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration, and the US Public Health Service), and interest earned from the Fund's investments.

On the consolidated Balance Sheet, assets section, the Fund Balance with Treasury \$5,000 thousand represents the funds held back at the end of the month for any unexpected expenses. Next, the \$87,475,115 thousand is the net investment of the fund, which is comprised of bills, bonds, notes, overnights, and Treasury Inflation-Protected Securities as well as interest receivable. Then the Accounts and Interest Receivable is the accounts receivable of \$43,105 thousand underpayment of contribution by the Army Reserve in FY 2005, the accounts receivable of \$10,025 thousand that the TRICARE debt collection contractors are collecting from the retirees, and the allowance for bad debts. Finally, the Other Assets of \$425,880 thousand is the advance that the Fund made to the Military Treatment Facilities for the first quarter of FY 2006.

The consolidated Balance Sheet, liabilities section, starts with \$537,397,092 thousand for the actuarial health insurance liability. After that, the \$1,036,034 thousand is comprised of Incurred But Not Reported (IBNR) amounts of \$769,904 thousand and \$284,131 thousand in accounts payable. Finally, the \$450,474,649 thousand is the net difference since inception of the activity between the revenues and expenses, interest revenue from investments, contributions, operating expenses, bad debt expenses, and future unfunded expenses.

Next, the consolidated Statement of Net Cost, has Total Program Costs of \$1,891,635 thousand. This is a combination of operating expenses, bad debt expenses, and future unfunded expenses. The Earned Revenue line is compromised of contributions and interest revenue from investments.

Last, the consolidated Statement Changes in Net Position displays the Net Position Beginning of the Period of \$477,660,055 thousand. This amount is the net difference since inception of the activity between the revenues and expenses, and the Net Cost of Operations of \$27,185,406 thousand, which represents interest revenue from investments, contributions, operating expenses, bad debt expenses, and future unfunded expenses.
