 CONTRACT ADMINISTRATION AND AUDIT SERVICES RATES  
 FOR THE  
 NATIONAL AERONAUTICS AND SPACE ADMINISTRATION  
FISCAL YEAR 2001

Composite hourly rates and target hour ceilings for contract administration and contract audit services to be provided by DoD activities to the National Aeronautics and Space Administration (NASA) in FY 2001 are as follows:

<sup>1/</sup> The above rates are effective October 1, 2000.

<sup>2/</sup> The Navy, DCMA and DCAA are responsible for management and further distribution of the target hours ceiling under their control.

<sup>3/</sup> The DoD/NASA agreement requires that reimbursements earned be monitored to determine if they are in line with annual hourly targets. Each DoD Component is to review billings at least quarterly and report to any significant deviations from its assigned hourly target.

<sup>4/</sup> The fiscal year 2001 agreement reflects an addition of 20,000 hours to the original 196,000 hours for a revised total of 216,000 hours for the Defense Contract Audit Agency and is consistent with the agreement that modification could be made if the excess hours exceed the 7 percent ceiling.
